(1) **Drittes KatNet-Treffen, 18.-20.07.2007 in Berlin**

Im Juli dieses Jahres findet in Berlin bereits das dritte Treffen des KatNet statt. Auch wer sich also nicht direkt vom vorgeschlagenen Thema oder den dortigen Fragen und Thesen angesprochen fühlt, sollte sich deshalb unbedingt nach Berlin begeben.

1. Book review: "Precautionary politics – principle and practice in confronting environmental risk" by Kerry H. Whiteside. The MIT Press 2006 Reviewed by Erik Persson

This book is partly introductory and partly discussing. A theme through the book is the comparison between the US and the European approach to the precautionary principle. The comparison falls out clearly to the advantage of the European approach. The author believes that the American approach is more technocratic and driven by "marginalist economic reasoning" while Europeans are more open to historical, sociological and philosophical aspects. He also puts some effort into nuancing the picture, however. He points out that the precautionary principle and a general precautionary attitude does play a role also in the US, and historically the US has some times even been in the forefront.

A whole chapter is dedicated to the question of gene technology. For those who have followed the discussion, this chapter does not contain any new facts or ideas. For the novice however it might work as a good introduction to the issue and some of its problems.

Philosophically, Whiteside considers the precautionary principle (PP) to be the concrete manifestation of a new and alternative way of looking at our relation with nature. A relation formed in light of our increased understanding of how incomplete our understanding of nature really is. He confers the philosophical basis of the precautionary principle to Hans Jonas and Bruno Latour. Whiteside is critical towards Jonas expressly authoritarian tendencies and towards Latour for being too allowing regarding experiments with nature. His conclusion is, however, that Jonas after all supplies a better understanding of the precautionary principle.

The author discusses and defends the PP against some of the common objections. He also makes the important point that it is misleading to contrast PP with "science-based decision-making". It is instead according to Whiteside a matter of doing science differently. In particular it is a matter of making it more transparent.

Above all, he argues that we need the precautionary principle because the traditional methods cannot meet the challenges from the new environmental risks. The traditional methods are according to Whiteside not adapted to deal with the magnitude of the things we perform and the values we put at risk or the slowness of the process and the non-linear behaviour of the environment. He points out that the slowness of environmental change is not least problematic when it comes to our relations to future generations: Today's decision makers get the benefits while future generations pay the costs.

An interesting aspect is that the author also discusses and defends the PP against criticism launched from the opposite perspective so to speak. Jean-Pierre Dupuy criticises the precautionary principle for being too weak, and for luring us into believing that we can manage the risks of modern technology by invoking extra precautions.

Whiteside finishes the book by a discussion of the democratic aspects. For him, public participation is one of the most important aspects of the principle, and he has some suggestions about how that should be done. He recognises that there are problems involved in inviting the public to take part in decisions concerning risks but he still think that the advantages prevail.

The advent of risk society (Ulrich Beck) signified many large scale and widespread social changes that are still taking place today in various forms. These changes bring the conception of social-cultural trauma right at the forefront of intellectual life and public debate.

In the context of trauma studies and the sociology/philosophy of emotions, an exciting dialogue between social theory and psychoanalysis is taking place. The whole book, in the last

instance, constitutes an original and substantial attempt to cure the various cultural and psychological traumas of the social subjects who experienced the risks and uncertainties of the adversarial political developments in modern (post-Civil-War) Greece.

The conference addresses regulation of chemicals and particularly the risks associated with them. The growing number and global diffusion of both chemicals themselves and regulation of chemicals imply a tremendous challenge for both research and policy. In Europe the most recent development of this is the emergence of the REACH programme of the European Union. Global developments are also of considerable interest however, and regulation on the national level is still very diverse.

The multidisciplinary nature of understanding and meeting this challenge is reflected in the conference, which welcomes contributions from both natural and social science. The conference is open for both academics and practitioners, including people representing the media, industry, government and NGOs. Although the geographical focus is on the development in Europe, observations from other parts of the world that are useful for comparative analysis are greatly appreciated.

Headline: HHS LAUNCHES NEW ONLINE TOOLKIT FOR MEDICAL RESPONSES TO RADIATION EMERGENCIES (Provided by Dave Freeman)

HHS Secretary Mike Leavitt today announced the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) has developed a new downloadable online diagnostic and treatment toolkit designed for health care providers, primarily physicians, who may have to provide medical care during a radiation incident.

The new information package includes easy-to-follow procedures for diagnosis and management of radiation contamination and exposure, guidance for the use of radiation medical countermeasures, and a variety of other features to facilitate medical responses. All of this is now available on the Radiation Event Medical Management (REMM) Web site (<http://REMM.NLM.GOV>).

"The REMM toolkit is part of our effort to improve public health emergency preparedness and response," Secretary Leavitt said. "It reflects the department's commitment to help instill a spirit of preparedness throughout our nation."

Guidance on diagnosis and treatment will help health care providers by describing:

- * types of radiation emergencies they may face
- * initial medical actions at the incident site and or medical facility
- * key steps in patient care

Critical information is presented in a format that will quickly and efficiently orient and guide health care providers during a mass casualty radiation event. In addition to online access, federal, state and local medical response teams will be able to download REMM information on laptop computers for quick access when they are deployed to a radiation incident or for training sessions. Users can also register for automatic e-mail updates whenever information is changed or added to the REMM Web site.

Future plans include formatting the REMM material for use on Personal Digital Assistant (PDA) devices, additional multimedia graphics, and more topic areas, such as follow-up patient care of radiation's chronic effects.

A team of subject matter experts from the HHS' Office of the Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response, the National Institutes of Health's National Cancer Institute and National Library of Medicine and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention collaborated on the development and design of the REMM tool.

National Council on Disability (NCD) Involvement (Provided by King County, WA OEM)

This is a summary of some of the things the NCD will be active with FEMA and DHS on:

Under the Homeland Security Appropriations bill (H.R. 5441) signed by President Bush on October 4, 2006, the National Council on Disability has been assigned key responsibilities for disability related issues in homeland security. These responsibilities involve the Administrator of FEMA working, in conjunction with other FEMA staff, with NCD and others (e.g., a National Advisory Council, organizations representing people with disabilities) on at least nine (9) major tasks including:

- Appointing a Disability Coordinator;
- Interacting regarding the needs of individuals with disabilities in emergency planning requirements and relief efforts in the event of a natural disaster, act of terrorism, or other man-made disaster;
- Completing, revising, and updating, as necessary, guidelines to define risk-based target capabilities for Federal, State, local, and tribal government preparedness that will enable the Nation to prevent, respond to, recover from, and mitigate against all hazards, including natural disasters, acts of terrorism, and others;
- Carrying out a national training program to implement the national preparedness goal, National Incident Management System, National Response Plan, and other related plans and strategies;
- Carrying out a national exercise program to test and evaluate the national preparedness goal, National Incident Management System, National Response Plan, and other related plans and strategies;
- Establishing a comprehensive system to assess, on an ongoing basis, the Nation's prevention capabilities and overall preparedness, including operational readiness;
- Establishing a remedial action management program to-- (1) analyze training, exercises, and real-world events to identify and disseminate lessons learned and best practices; (2) generate and disseminate, as appropriate, after action reports to participants in exercises and real-world events; and (3) conduct remedial action tracking and long-term trend analysis;
- Developing, coordinating, and maintaining a National Disaster Housing Strategy; and
- Developing guidelines to accommodate individuals with disabilities, which shall include guidelines for: (1) the accessibility of, and communications and programs in, shelters, recovery centers, and other facilities; and (2) devices used in connection with disaster operations, including first aid stations, mass feeding areas, portable payphone stations, portable toilets, and temporary housing.

NCD met during the last week of February with key FEMA and DHS staff, as well as with national organizations representing people with disabilities, about these key responsibilities and the direction FEMA is taking to fulfill its new disability mandates under H.R. 5441. FEMA management also testified in February before the House Committee on Homeland Security regarding the overall direction it is taking to strengthen its operations and infrastructure.

US Naval Post Graduate School & US Department of Homeland Security Masters Degree Program

The Department of Homeland Security has partnered with the Naval Postgraduate School (NPS), a Military Institution for Advanced Degree work, to offer a Homeland Security Leadership Development Program for state and local emergency responders and administrative staffs. The Program will result in a Master of Arts Degree in Security Studies: Homeland Security and Defense.

This Program has been designed to educate and develop state and local personnel who will be the future leaders in their agencies and organizations. This challenging program engages the students in a course of study that enables them to develop strategies, plans and programs to reduce America's vulnerability to terrorism, build the organizational arrangements needed to

strengthen interagency cooperation, and sharpens their ability to make improvements in existing homeland security preparedness by conducting "real world" actionable policy development work.

The program is a mix of in-residence work at NPS and an innovative distance learning syllabus via the internet that allows the students to continue working in their present position and begin applying what they are learning and mastering in the program to their positions at the state and local level.

The Degree Program was stood-up in January 2003 and as of 1/1/2007 has awarded 120 Master of Arts Degrees in Security Studies: Homeland Security and Defense. FEMA Region IV accounts for 13 of those degrees with 11 more students presently completing course work. The State of Florida accounts for 4 degrees with 5 students completing course work. The single person who has received a degree from the southern Florida area, Florida Region 7, is Ruben Almaguer, a former Division Chief from Miami-Dade Fire Rescue, and presently a Homeland Security Official for Florida State in Tallahassee.

Florida is a key state in the Homeland Security matrix and southern Florida is a critical node for the nation with a unique mix of Homeland Security issues and relationships. The Program Outreach Committee from CHDS has targeted the state as a priority recruitment area not only for what the program has to offer to the area, but what the southern Florida challenges and successes has to give to the nation. We are targeting any agency that has a role in homeland security with priority areas being:

State and Local Homeland Security and Emergency Management professionals,
Government Administrators,
Law Enforcement,
Fire and EMS,
Public Health,
Public Works, and,
PIO's from state and major cities.

The titles or positions that we are also prioritizing are:

- Administrators who manage Fusion Centers (non-FBI),
- Homeland Security and Emergency Management state or regional Administrators,
- High Density, high population public safety administrators, and,
- people responsible for coordinating homeland security or emergency management functions critical jurisdictions.

The Department of Homeland Security, Preparedness Directorate, Office of Grants and Training, pays all expenses incurred by the student for travel, per diem, tuition, books and board..

Mr. William Kelley, the Project Director for the program from the Office of Grants and Training, DHS, and Vin Doherty, the Director of Program Outreach for the Center of Homeland Defense and Security (CHDS) at the Naval Postgraduate School (NPS), Monterey, CA. will be coming to the Miami-Dade County Emergency Operations Center for an information session on March 20, 2007 at 1400.
